


Jesus promised 2,000 years ago that He would build His church and He continues to do that. We here at Gracepoint are one strain of the Church body.

THE FAMILY

The Al-Gburi family is a family of eight from Iraq via Syria. They are now awaiting tickets to Canada from a refugee camp in Turkey and will arrive February 16!

The family fled Iraq because of religious persecution.

The father's name is Yaseen and the mother's name is Hana.

They have three daughters: Maria, Maryam and Maimoonah - ages 13, 11 and 10; and three sons: Mustafa, Yousif and Ahmed – ages 8, 6 and 4. The two youngest sons were born in Syria.

Yaseen has experience working as a hairdresser and Hana in housekeeping.

They are all Arabic speaking so we do not know if they will be able to communicate in English.

THE SPONSORSHIP

We were told by the Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) blended sponsorship agent they will likely arrive one to three months after November 24, 2015. We eagerly await their arrival.

We have secured accommodation for them for the year and we are busy planning their schedule for the first two weeks after they arrive. We have also been busy preparing their new home. A Gracepoint welcome reception for the Al-Gburis will be planned at a Sunday lunch shortly after their arrival and we will try to notify all who signed up as volunteers with a special invite.

Our steering team is faithfully served by the following individuals: Lois Waterton (Chair), Lisa Terrace (Treasurer), Deb Mitchell (Care Teams), John Howatt and Ernie Isaac with assistance from care team coordinators: Tamara Raison, Terry Tucker, Warren Terrace, Ed and Maggie Thiessen, Vince and Dana Penner and Cecil Rast. These care teams will meet all the practical needs of the family including socialization, transportation, accommodations, medical and dental, shopping, language and education.

Thank you to so many who have contributed with finances, time, ideas and donated items. Thank you to over 50 volunteers who have expressed interest in helping! We are going to need you all as the year progresses and please contact any of the steering team with questions or expertise. Please know how blessed we feel to be welcoming the Al-Gburis with the support of the whole Gracepoint family.

It is so exciting to be doing something knowing that God's will is to give this needy family hope and a future. We are convinced that God is able to do far more that we ask or imagine for His glory.



FOR CHILDREN FROM 1 MONTH TO GRADE 5

KIDS UNLIMITED CHECK-IN (for kids 2 years - Grade 5)

Check-in at the KU table in the lobby before the service. Worship with your kids in-service until they are invited to the front and dismissed to their teaching time with their leaders. Parents are more than welcome (and encouraged) to accompany their children to their classes. Please check in babies 0-23 months directly in the Nursery.

KIDS UNLIMITED REGISTRATION

(for kids 0 years - Grade 5)

If you're new or haven't already completed a KU Registration or Visitor Form, please do so you can stay up to date on what's happening. Visit the check-in table in the lobby today.

KIDS UNLIMITED DROP-OFF / PICK-UP

For safety purposes, children (Nursery-Grade 5) should remain with their parents until they are dismissed from the service. Parents must pick up their children immediately following the service.

NURSERY

(0-23 months)

Parent-Participation Nursery opens at 10am. Volunteer Caregivers will be on duty to supervise and assist in the Nursery once children are dismissed from the service (approximately 15 minutes after the service begins).

The Fireside Room is available for nursing moms from 10am until noon.

Baby Mum Mums are available upon request as a snack. To keep the Nursery allergen-free and food-safe, no other food is permitted.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

(2-3 years & 4-5 years)

Parents of preschoolers are welcome and encouraged to accompany their children downstairs to their classes when dismissed from the service.

ELEMENTARY

(Grades 1-5)

Children join their grade group outside of Studio A before going in for their large-group teaching time. They will then go to their small group classroom. Parents pick up after the service in the classrooms.

In this edition of Connection Point I'd like to let you in a little on the

process of getting ready for a major season in the Christian calendar and what that looks like in the worship arts ministry. Let's take a look at Advent through Epiphany. For those who are unfamiliar with these two terms as they relate to what is more generally referred to as the Christmas season, here are a couple of definitions.

Ad·vent /'ædvənt/

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1. (noun) the first season of the Christian church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays.

2. (noun) CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY - the coming or second coming of Christ.

Synonyms: arrival, appearance, emergence, materialization, occurrence, dawn, birth, rise, development.

1. the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1–12).

2. the festival commemorating the Epiphany on January 6.

3. a manifestation of a divine or supernatural being.

4. a moment of sudden revelation or insight.

latent or nascent creative gifts. God is most glorified as His people do the work of worshipping Him. That's Leitourgia. That's a love story.







Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must turn from your selfish ways, take up your cross, and follow me."

Matthew 16:24



Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ.

1 Corinthians 11:1

Dear brothers and sisters, pattern your lives after mine, and learn from those who follow our example.

Philippians 3:17

In our culture, the idea of being labeled as "a follower" has negative connotations. When it is said "she or she is a follower," it implies that they cannot think for themselves. However, I can think of two exceptions where following is viewed favourably. It is acceptable to admit to being a follower (or to follow) when someone speaks of following someone's blog and when we are talking about someone having a certain amount of *Facebook* followers.

The truth is, we are all followers of those before or around us. If you disagree, check out your dress style, the way you speak, the authors you read, the podcasts you listen to, who you aspire to be like, whose sports stats or earnings you keep an eye on, or who you admire.

To follow means to pattern our lives after someone, to imitate them. Patterning our lives or following someone worthy of intimating should be celebrated. Following the ideas of those who have been successful in an aspect of life (anything from fitness to business goals) is commendable.

Similarly, it is important to make sure that we pattern our lives after the ONE who offers us the greatest success in life. What have we gained if we do not address the core of who we are? There is so much we want to be successful at. However, we must give priority to being successful in what really matters. Otherwise, we can become distracted by numerous secondary pursuits.

Jesus said,

And what do you benefit if you gain the whole world but lose your own soul? Is anything worth more than your soul? If anyone is ashamed of me and my message in these adulterous and sinful days, the Son of Man will be ashamed of that person when He returns in the glory of His Father with the holy angels.

Mark 8:36-38

This is a hard saying of Jesus. Yet, Jesus said it because He loves us. He does not want us to ultimately spoil our lives by the worship or endless pursuit of lesser goals like worldly riches, hard bodies or fame that will rob us of joy. If Jesus is not the center of our lives, we fail to follow him. It's an issue of primary and secondary priorities.

Our greatest pursuit should be to grow as followers of Jesus. To follow Jesus, means we pattern our lives around those practises that lead us to be spiritually, physically, psychologically, and emotionally healthy. Jesus gave us a pattern to live. We are to balance the relationships of life (see Luke 6:12-19). An "**UP**" relationship with the Father (v.12), "**IN**" community with other disciples (vv.13-16) and "**OUT**" in ministry to the lost (vv. 17-19). By this pattern our desire for love, transformation, peace, rest, service and significance are met.







Gracepoint has an amazing outreach service through the weekly Sunday Night Community Dinner. The dinner takes place right in same room that the congregation meets in on Sunday morning. By mid-afternoon the room is set-up to host 200 people. Our friends and family in Christ are the hungry, elderly, lonely, hearing impaired, mentally ill and the working poor. People of all ages-from seniors to mothers with babies and young children-are part of this community. As a church, we practice hospitality by providing a full course nutritious meal in a welcoming, non-threatening, non-judgmental, safe environment.

As well as food for the body, there is nourishment for the soul. The devotional time each evening creates space for people to have their spiritual needs met. Prayer, counseling and referral to services (shelters, mental health facilities) are also provided.

Giving Back: \$700 raised by our dinner family in support of our Refugee Family (this is in addition to the \$1,650 that was donated for the Mexico Mission trip in July)

Family Feel: There is a growing movement of dinner attendees advancing from strangers, to friends, to family members.

Kristen Corrigan Gracepoint Missionary serving at ETEM-IBVIE

We continue to see God's blessings being poured out, even (or perhaps especially) amidst the trials. We continue to grow, have opportunities to serve.

ETEM-IBVIE is about to change its name and become one entity. Comprising of the Mennonite Brethren School "ETEM" and the Christian and Missionary Alliance in Canada School "IBVIE," the new name will be École de Théologie Evangélique du Québec - ÉTEQ (the Quebec School of Evangelical Theology). Our relationship with Laval University continues to be strong - through which we now offer three certificates including a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's in Theology.

We are thankful that God continues to bless our ministry. Enrollment has climbed steadily over the past four years - we anticipate another increase in the winter semester with more than 80 students, up from 70 students just a year ago.

Life is full of change and when the Spirit of God gets a hold of you, that change can be quite unsettling. Imagine only being able to talk with the limited understanding and vocabulary of a toddler in a new language? Imagine trying to figure out who you can trust? Imagine adapting to new foods, rhythms and pace? Imagine being plopped into a team of people, only to realize **24** that it's going to take a while to

Applied to global missionary workers, this assessment revealed that the typical missionarv averages a level of 300 and that missionaries in their first term could hit 900! Yikes.

So, should people just not go to other cultures with the Good News? It's interesting we might think that way, for wouldn't we say that disobeying the prompting and leading of the Holy Spirit is the opposite of the call of Jesus?

Yes, people should go-and willbecause the Spirit of God leads us to find the greatest joy in the greatest surrenders. Are we not

to surrender our will for the Father's will every day and everywhere?

So, what should we do? Well, let's remember the church is the body of Christ. Some parts of our bodies reach places and are exposed to stresses other parts aren't (my fingers are more susceptible to getting burned than my spleen for instance), but that doesn't make the exposed parts more special; it just means they are parts of the wonderful and necessary variety for my body to function. In the same way, let me encourage you who are called to live on mission closer to your "home" culture to not forget those parts of the body who are reaching somewhere else. Pray for them, learn what they're facing, show grace, support them financially, encourage them, and keep valuing the extension of the body of Christ to corners where the light has not yet shone.

MISSIONARY REPORT: The Power of Influence Arlene Friesen Gracepoint Missionary serving with Youth Unlimited

In all our lives we have influences that are generational. Some are very good and others can be destructive. In many of the kids' lives that we work with, most influences are negative. Everyday as I connect with the kids I am challenging them with the question, "Are you the one that will break the negative generational cycles in your life?"

There are strongholds in all our lives that can stop us from growing. There are times when I have to ask God to pull me away from some of the strongholds in my own life that can keep me from being all He has called me to be.

This is the verse tattooed on the arm of "J," a young girl

I can do **all things** through Christ, who strengthens me. Philippians 4:13

that I have been walking alongside for a few years. We met regularly throughout last summer and one day in July she asked me if I could take her to a medical clinic to see if she was pregnant. We were both relieved that the test result was negative. We have had many talks about life choices and putting herself at risk of getting pregnant but the influences surrounding her have made it difficult for her to change.

It was about two months later that she confided in me again that she was pregnant. She had just celebrated her sixteenth birthday. My heart broke for her, but I told her I would walk through this chapter of her life with her and support her in any way I could. We talked about the difficulties of being a young teen mom and I brought up **Connection Point** the possibility of giving the baby up for adoption. Her own mother was just 16 when she had her, so "J" was following her family's generational cycle. She told me that her grandmother had raised her and that both her grandmother and mother have addiction problems. She has grown up in this environment all her life.

My hope is that she does not repeat the cycle of addiction with the pressure of raising a child at 16. My prayer is that the verse tattooed on her arm will bring her to believe that God wants to walk alongside her. Our job as a community is to surround her, and all the "others" - to offer the strength needed to break the negative cycles.

With a good support system and a God who answers prayers, I am confident to say anything is possible.

Thank you for helping us here at Youth Unlimited and being a part of what God is doing in the lives of these kids. Extra thankfulness you for giving me the opportunity to help these teens as they face life—obstacles and all even when they choose poorly. Most of these teens just want to be loved and it is privilege to be on the front lines, offering out that love in lavish measure.

Don't get me wrong, there are people who do this all the time. Studies show the process actually has many mental health benefits. Some might say it is like visiting an old friend. There is an emotional response which links the action to a specific moment in your past.

But, I don't do it. Or I should say, I hadn't done it.

That is, I hadn't read a book more than once, ever....until I reread the books of my childhood to my daughter Miranda. Every night, Miranda would ask me to read a book before she went to bed. I believed that reading to her would stimulate

her imagination and motivate her to be a reader. I dutifully read the classics: "Anne of Green Gables," the "Little House on the Prairie" series, even "Pippi Longstocking" and many others. I thoroughly enjoyed the stories myself and excitedly regaled Miss Miranda with each adventure.

Knowing the storyline, and many times

having seen a movie based on the book, I remembered the plots and could recall the characters. I knew, for the most part, that the story would have a happy ending. Of course, seeing the stories again through a young child's eyes made them come to life in a new way.

Like I said before, I don't usually reread books. I did, however, read and study many of the books of the Bible during my two years at Columbia Bible College. Back then, there weren't a lot of study majors. Courses such as "the Pentateuch," "I & II Corinthians" and "the synoptic Gospels" required that I read these books as part of the curriculum. As well, participating in various Bible studies over the years through church and Sunday school, I have read the Bible in its entirety in my lifetime.

So as a new year has begun, it is a tradition to make resolutions of all kinds, I resolved to (re) read the Bible in 366 days. I get an extra day, it's a leap year.

I started with YouVersion's "the One Year® Bible", which is an app on my mobile phone. There are different ways to go about it, but usually you need to read several chapters each day. Suggestions on different plans of reading through the scriptures include chronological, historical, Old and New Testament together, beginning to end or a blended way. There are many plans out there and it is simple to start your journey.

There are many reasons to read through the Bible, too. A guaranteed result will be getting more in tune to God and His will. I believe that by getting into His Word, you will also have your eyes open to knowledge and God's will for your life.

What is less simple is sticking to the commitment. A commitment to continue once you begin reading may have its challenges. I suggest tackling it with a friend or spouse, a home group or triad. If you fall behind in reading, don't get discouraged or give up. The goal of reading the whole bible within a year isn't the goal. The goal is growing closer to God. As you read, be in prayer and ask God what He is teaching you through the text.

"The only sure rule is to remember that the Bible is indeed God's gift to the church, to equip that church for it to work in the world, and that serious study of it can and should become one of the places where, and the means by which, heaven and earth interlock and God's future purposes arrive in the present". N.T. Wright.

Already, in the first few days of my challenge, I have come to new realizations and understanding. Just like reading the children's stories to Miranda, the stories of the Bible are coming to life in a new and exciting way. And I know it has a happy ending...
